

The Fish Finder section of the website provides users with access to detailed information about individual species.

New Zealand seafood is produced in an environment that is rich in marine habitats and species. With the 4th largest ocean territory in the world, and as many as 65,000 species living in it, it's no wonder New Zealand invests so much time and effort into managing the marine environment.

Supply Chain

New Zealand has a reputation as a trusted supplier of food. In fact, the provision of safe and suitable food is critical to the New Zealand economy. This is why the New Zealand Government provides a strong regulatory framework to ensure seafood is legal, safe and fit for purpose.

People

The New Zealand seafood industry employs over 13,000 people both on land and at sea. New Zealand Maori have significant commercial and customary interests in seafood enshrined in the Treaty of Waitangi in 1840. The rights and welfare of commercial and indigenous fishers are specified in New Zealand law.
