



The New Zealand Government has placed duties on the seafood industry to ensure the health and safety of everyone involved in the business. These requirements apply on all commercial fishing vessels and cannot be contracted out of.

In 2017/18, the fishing

sector had 23 serious harm

incidents and 2 fatalities.







Government and industry are working to reduce maritime sector incidents by 25% between 2016 and 2021.

NEW ZEALAND APPROACH

Legal requirements for workplace health and safety are prescribed in two Acts of Parliament. In broad terms, the Maritime Transport Act focus on the safety of the vessel and navigational safety, while the Health and Safety at Work Act focuses on the health and safety of the people on board.

COMPLIANCE

fishing vessels to have a certified safety management system in place. This system must cover vessel and personal safety. Operators are also responsible for identifying and controlling risks to health and safety so far as is reasonably practicable.
